Letter from the President

April 2008

Dear WMSC Friends and Families,

As a spectator sport, soccer remains an oddity. Twenty-two players of utmost skill, often fail to score a single goal after running hard during the allotted 90 minutes of play. Consequently, in the U.S., television coverage is limited at best -- although recently expanded to capture up-close cameos of a sidelined David Beckham or more importantly, his celebrated wife.

Last fall, I had the opportunity to join 80,000 avid Europeans watch the German National team square off against a venerable Czech team. In business meetings over the next few days, every conversation began with a debate on the woes of the German team. One month later I watched two of America's best teams face off in a stadium of similar capacity, albeit with a (relatively apathetic) audience of only 4,000. Also, trials and tribulations of the US women during the 2007 World Cup hardly made the news. So much for America's appreciation of what's universally known as the beautiful sport.

Despite lack of spectator success, U.S. participation in the sport continues to grow -- nearly 3 million youth are now playing soccer in the United States. West Morris also continues to expand. With nearly 1,500 participants in our intramural and travel programs we also rank among the biggest soccer clubs in the state -- and the largest youth athletic organization in the local area. The breadth of our offerings remains strong, from introductory programs for Kindergarteners through high school aged premier teams, playing under the PFC label.

Intramural Program

Fun, skill development, and promoting continued participation -- that's at the core of our intramural program. However, with approximately 1000 participants, the expectations, skills and commitment level of the group is diverse. Over the past couple of years, we've examined how best to address issues posed by youth participation outstripping parental ability to coach the game, field availability and a host of other issues. After a series of meetings with our training partner, last fall we moved in a direction of flex-scheduling for our practices. The new training routine was a step in the right direction, however this year; we'll be modifying to regain the benefits of team-oriented practices while retaining the benefits of scheduling flexibility.

In many seasons, weather proves to cut down on playing time. Last fall, we were fortunate in playing most all of our scheduled games. The annual Halloween tournament brought a smile to many faces.

Travel Program

The WMSC travel program has grown materially and this spring will include 34 teams. The majority of our teams compete in Morris County Youth Soccer Association (MCYSA) -- where WMSC ranks as the second largest club among the six dozen members. This spring, 12 boys and girls teams at U-10 and below will represent the club in MCYSA. An additional 13 teams will represent WMSC at age U-11 and above. With nine teams now participating in other leagues (including CNJYSA, MAPs and JAGS) WMSC's reach continues to expand.

During 2007, our teams took top honors as MCYSA flight winners on nine occasions. Credit goes out to the fall 2007 champion U-9 Panthers, U-11 PFC Fire and U-13 Predators. During the spring, the U-8 Hurricanes, U-8 Hornets, U-10 Blue Storm, U-12 Predators, U-13 Sparks and U-17 Patriots claimed top honors as well. Our teams in other leagues posted similar success.

The PFC program continues to expand, offering home-grown players increased opportunity to showcase their talent within the arena of our local club. Several of our PFC teams have achieved meaningful success in state cup and other tournament play. Many of the PFC teams include local high school players who re-unite after their fall school season concludes. Watching the

development of these players is clearly inspiring, particularly for our current crop of young players. We encourage WMSC families to come out and watch these games, often played at Black River each weekend.

Fields

The responsibilities of our fields trustee are daunting – and the responsibilities continue to expand. Our work with local communities to appropriately utilize existing field space and procure new facilities requires a material effort. This year we've initiated projects including the installation of an irrigation well at Chubb Park and an improved maintenance plan.

Local governments are making progress on establishing a regionalized approach to field usage and development – a concept that we've promoted for years. We owe appreciation to municipal officials, recreation volunteers and public works departments for recognizing the importance of field space to youth athletics. Nonetheless, access to quality fields remains a critical issue. Each fall, the club runs approximately 150 practices and 70 games per week. Demands on existing fields continue to increase and without sufficient facilities, training will be impacted.

A word of thanks

The tireless efforts of our volunteers enables the program to thrive. I thank all of them: coaches, team parents and our trustees for their time and dedication. This year, four of our trustees are moving on. While our work standing shoulder-to-shoulder in the trenches will not continue, our friendships will endure. If there were ever an advertisement on the virtues of volunteerism at WMSC it should include a clip on the value of friendships made among our devoted volunteers.

John Tatum, a devoted and long-standing WMSC trustee will be relocating to Utah in coming months. Over the years, John served in a variety of roles, most recently serving as an officer and treasurer. Paul Tomasi, our 2007 VP of Intramurals, did an excellent job in facilitating changes in the practice regimen last season. For the past several years he also worked tirelessly in building out WMSC's online presence and fundraising. Paul's ever-positive demeanor will be missed. Amalia Duarte moved our fields program forward and now continues her work on a local Recreation Commission. She brought clear thinking and structure to an increasingly important role within the club. Ed Powers also served in a variety of roles, including heading up our intramural program and previously, field scheduling. Ed's volunteer involvement has recently been channeled to baseball. The baton now passes to our new trustees who'll take up where their predecessors left off. I have every confidence that WMSC will thrive with their involvement.

I'd also like to thank the growing list of WMSC sponsors who've generously provided their support of our program. Their assistance has been critical in our ability to maintain stability in program fees, despite rising costs.

Goals for the year ahead

In 2007, we made improvement on several fronts, including an update and ratification of the WMSC Constitution and By-Laws. This year, we'll further tighten operating standards and place an increased focus on training and education. We'll also seek to better define policies and standards for the travel program. Over the coming months, I'll be soliciting input and volunteers to assist in developing a strategic plan.

Keep the traditions alive and keep the game in the game.

- Only online registration available this year; no paper registrations. The local libraries have public computers available for your use if you do not have a home computer. There will be no in-person registration this year (we will not be accepting paper registrations at the Strawberry festival either) You must register online!
- Travel Registration deadline: **April 27th**
- Intramural Registration deadline: **June 9th**
- Newsletter will not be mailed this year; all information is posted on the club website.
- There will be a girls and a boys intramurals program for Kindergarten, for 1st Grade, for 2nd\3rd Grade, for 4th\5th Grade, and for 6-8th Grade.

How to Register

Log onto our website at www.westmorrisoccer.org. Click on the **green Registration tab** at the top and select the programs for your child. If you are new to WMSC, you will be prompted to create a family username and password. If you are returning WMSC family, you will be prompted to enter your family username and password. If you cannot remember your username or password, follow the directions within the registration process to request the information. If you still encounter any problems, please email us webmaster@wmsconline.com. The registration page has detailed instructions for the steps for registering for intramural soccer.

Once you have username and password, you can update your family information at any time by accessing the data by clicking on the red **My Account** button on the top menu bar.



Intramural Soccer Program Fall 2008 Season

The primary goal for the Intramural Program is to make sure that our kids have fun and learn the skills of soccer. With over 1,000 children in the 2007 Fall Intramural Soccer Program, the program's success was made possible with you, our volunteer parent/coaches. We continue to need your help and support. We will also continue to seek your feedback to ensure that we remain on the right course and improve whenever possible.

The intramural program includes one weekday practice and one game each Saturday during September and October. Also, every player participates in WMSC's full-day, end of season tournament in late October/early November.

The intramural program does not entail the same level of commitment as our travel program, however, players that sign-up are expected to participate in the majority of games and practices. Teams are right-sized to maximize play-time – as a result, non-attendance does have an impact.

Fees for Intramural Soccer:

Kindergarten	\$95/player
Grades 1-8	\$120/player

Family Discount is applied for the third child or more at \$60 per player. If the 3rd child is a Kindergartner the discount is applied to the highest player fee of \$120. *Travel players are not included in calculation for the family discount.*

Deadline for intramural registration is June 9th.

A \$20 per player late fee is required for those registering after the deadline of June 9th.

Please note that registrations will not be accepted after July 15th.

No refunds will be given after July 31st.

Please Note: No Request Policy

WMSC strives to form balanced teams within each grade/grade group level. The criteria used to form teams includes coaches rating of the player from the previous year, grade, and in the lower age groups, residency. In an effort to be fair to all players and families, the club does not accept requests regarding placing players together or placing players with certain coaches. Exceptions to this policy would include siblings in the same age group; coaches are placed with their children, and hardship cases approved by the Board.

Intramural Coordinators

With approximately 300 coaches involved in our program, coordination is vital. Volunteer coordinators take on the important role of liaisons between the WMSC board, our Vice President of Intramurals, coaches and parents.

Travel Program Fall 2008-Spring 2009 Season

The West Morris Soccer Club Travel Soccer Program has approximately 440 players competing on 35 travel teams spanning U8 - U18 age groups. The program has grown significantly over the last two years thanks to your support and commitment. The travel program was created for players who desire to play at a more competitive level. The overall goal for the travel program is player development. Through our alliance with professional training organizations, our players learn more advanced soccer skills and game strategies. They also gain a greater knowledge of the game of soccer and continue to learn good sportsmanship and teamwork.

Playing travel soccer involves a greater time commitment than our Intramural Program. Two, 90 minute practice sessions are held each week. The program includes one professionally led practice and one coach led practice session. Most games are played on Sunday afternoons. A majority of the teams participate in the Morris County Youth Soccer Association (MCYSA) which requires each team to play a 10 game schedule in the Fall and 10 games in the Spring. Away games usually require no more than 60 minutes travel time and often, less. The West Morris Soccer Club also has an affiliation with the following New Jersey leagues; MIDS, JAGS and MAPS which gives teams options in terms of competition level as well as number of games per season. The club also encourages each team to play one tournament during the year which is included in the base cost of the program.

Players are expected to attend all practices and games, and are required to play both Fall and Spring seasons.

Training

Our soccer club was built around the concept of parent/coaches – we strongly support volunteerism and parental involvement. However as the game has increased in complexity, more teams are relying on professional trainers for both practices and game-day coaching. We believe that the trend towards more professional training holds positive attributes. Over the past few years we've adapted our program to address the needs of providing a higher degree of professional training and additionally, offer stronger guidelines on use of professional trainers at younger age groups. We've increased the number of training organizations available so as to better meet the needs of individual teams. We've established relationships that will maximize the opportunity of trainers that can stay with a team over the course of several seasons. The approaches outlined below provide definition to our current program.

The introductory level for travel soccer is intended for the U-8 through U-10 age groups. The basic program includes one professional-lead practice, one parent/coach-lead practice and a parent/coach as the game day coach. Costs for participation at this level will not differ from those outlined at the time of registration. However, based on agreement from participating families and subject to approval of the board, teams in these age groups will have the option to increase professional training. Costs associated with the additional training will to be born by all participating families.

The intermediate level travel program will consist of a professional trainer running both practices and the game. Teams at this level will also include one to two parent/coaches who will assist the professional trainer. This program is currently being used within our club by a significant number teams at the U-11 and above age groups. Over time we will expect that all first-teams at U-11

and above utilize a professional trainer for all practices and games. **As a reminder, families accepting participation on the first team at U-11 and above might incur additional costs for training. This could be in the range of \$200-300 per year beyond our basic fee which will be charged prior to the start of the fall season.**

The advanced level includes all aspects of the intermediate program with the addition of a specified winter program and more tournaments. This program is primarily intended for the PFC program, however could potentially be used by non-PFC teams as well.

Fees for Travel Soccer (subject to the above):

U8 thru U14: **\$325**

The base fee for the travel program is \$325. Once a player accepts a place on a team, the fee is non-refundable. Also, teams which use professional trainers for both practices (and any games), will incur additional training fees of approximately \$200 - \$350 per year. Individual teams control their expenses based on added practice and game-day coaching at WMSC's prenegotiated rates with each training organization. This year, fees for additional training will be collected up-front based on anticipated use of their professional trainer.

Team Formation

Small-Sided Teams: For age groups **U-8** through **U-10**, **MINIMUM** roster size will be **10** players; **MAXIMUM** roster size will be **12** players. A team will be formed in an age group only if a minimum of 10 players register and try out.

Large-Sided Teams: For age groups **U-11** through **U-14**, **MINIMUM** roster size will be **13** players; **MAXIMUM** roster size will be **16** players. A team will be formed in an age group only if a minimum of 13 players register and try out.

For teams in age groups **U-11** through **U-14** that initially have less than the maximum number of players allowed (but at least have the minimum number required of 13), additional players can be sought to fill the remaining roster spots using out-of-town players, if needed.

After first team rosters are set, additional teams may be formed by using the guidelines above. If additional teams cannot be formed, remaining players have the option to play in the Intramural Program and will be placed in that program, if they desire.

For age groups **U-15** & older, our teams play in the Spring season only to avoid conflicts with high school sports. For those teams, registration & advertised tryouts will be held prior to the Spring 2009 season. Tryouts will be open to in-town & out-of-town players.

After teams are finalized, several documents are required from players to be granted a player card from the league, These include a league membership form, a medical release form, a sage document, a uniform order, and a copy of the player's birth certificate The forms can be downloaded from our website. Look for details.



Patriot F.C. Program 2008-2009 Season

The Patriot Football Club provides an organized and competitive environment designed to help highly skilled players achieve their maximum potential, while allowing a robust, high-quality sporting experience for both the players and their families. Patriot F.C. teams are formed independently from the club's travel program.

Expectations for play at the PFC level include a more full-time commitment to soccer. WMSC supports involvement in multiple sports, however, the player's first commitment need be to his or her PFC team. While guidelines for practices, tournaments and winter training are set at the team level, a very high level of participation and commitment is expected.

2008-2009 Travel & PFC Team Age Groups

Guidelines for Age Groups:

U-8 (born between August 1, 2000 & July 31, 2001)

U-9 (born between August 1, 1999 & July 31, 2000)

U-10 (born between August 1, 1998 & July 31, 1999)

U-11 (born between August 1, 1997 & July 31, 1998)

U-12 (born between August 1, 1996 & July 31, 1997)

U-13 (born between August 1, 1995 & July 31, 1996)

U-14 (born between August 1, 1994 & July 31, 1995)

There will be **TWO** tryout dates for each age group. Players **MUST ATTEND** at least **ONE** session, but are encouraged to attend both sessions.

On the day of your child's first scheduled tryout, a handout of the tryouts procedure and a specially designed tryout t-shirt with your child's individual tryout number, will be handed out during check in. **The t-shirts, not travel uniforms, are to be worn for the duration of the tryout period. No portion of current travel uniforms are permitted to be worn during tryouts.**

Players are strongly encouraged to tryout in their appropriate age group. The WMSC Board of Trustees will only allow players to try out for older age teams in accordance with our Playing up policy. **Please send an e-mail to webmaster@wmsconline.com or call Steve Kovalsky, VP Travel at 973-953-8028 with any questions**
